06 JUL (Monday):

SAINT MARIA GORETTI, Virgin and Martyr (1890-1902)

Maria was born to a poor farming family in Corinaldi, Italy, and spent a difficult childhood assisting her widowed mother. She was devout and often at prayer. In 1902, at age 12, she was attacked by a young man intent on seduction. When she refused to submit, he stabbed her repeatedly. As she lay dying, she forgave him. The man was imprisoned and was unrepentant until he had a dream in which Maria appeared to him from heaven. He was converted at that point, and testified at her canonization in 1950.

09 JUL (Friday):

SAINT AUGUSTINE ZHAO HONG and COMPANIONS, Martyrs (d. ~1815)

The *Martyrs of China*, they were imprisoned and died for their faith and work. Augustine was a soldier who escorted **Saint Gabriel John Tauin du-Fresse** to Beijing during his missionary work. Augustine became a convert to Christianity and a priest, working in the Sichuan apostolic vicarate.

11 JUL (Saturday):

SAINT BENEDICT, Abbot (480-543)

The “Father of Western Monasticism” was educated in Rome and, repelled by the vices of the world, decided to live the life of a hermit. He organized his many followers into 12 monasteries, including



Monte Cassino, which became the birthplace of Western monasticism. The rule he wrote for his monks prescribed common sense, moderate asceticism, prayer, study, work and community life under one superior. It would serve as the model of monastic life in the West for centuries to come.

WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES

The **World Meeting of Families** is an international event, begun by St. John Paul II in 1994. In 2015, it will be held for the first time ever in the United States, in Philadelphia, from **22-27 September 2015**. 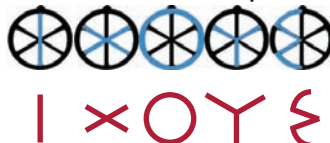


So what is the "ichthys symbol" (ICK-thoos)? It was a sign used by early Christians (1st and 2nd centuries A.D.) to identify one another as fellow believers in Jesus. In the early days of the Church, Christians had to practice their faith in secret: to openly be a follower of Jesus meant persecution and probably a martyr's death. So Christians had to meet secretly in each other's homes to pray, teach, and learn more about Our Lord. You might have found this symbol drawn in the dirt or carved near a door, and if you were a Christian, you would have known that

another Christian lived there. When two travelers met on the road, one might draw half of the symbol (just one of the arches). If the other traveler completed the symbol by drawing the other arch, both would know they were in the company of a believer.

The letters are Greek (which was the common language in those days) and spell the word "fish". But Christians used each of the letters to stand for "Iesous Christos, Theou Ulios, Soter", which means "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior".

In another form of the symbol, the five letters were drawn on top of each other, and the result looks like a 6-spoked wheel.



You can see many examples of the "wheel" symbol around the ruins of Ephesus in Turkey.
