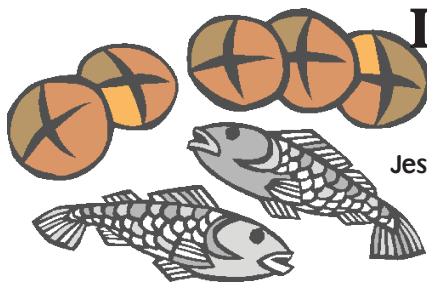

**29 JUL (Wednesday):**

## SAINT MARTHA

The sister of **Saints Lazarus** and **Mary of Bethany**, she was a friend of Jesus and a hostess to Him in her house. She is believed to have taken part in an early mission to France (Gaul).

*“Martha, Martha,” the Lord answered, “you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.”*

**30 JUL (Thursday):**

## SAINT PETER CHRYSOLOGUS, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (406-450)

An adult convert, **Peter** became the **Bishop of Ravenna, Italy** in 433. He fought paganism and heresies, enforced reforms, and build several churches. He was a preacher of such language skills that he was given the name *Chrysologus*, referring to his *golden word*. 176 of his sermons have survived, and these beautiful explanations of the Incarnation, the Creed, and the place of Mary and John the Baptist in the plan of salvation, led to his being proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1729 by **Pope Benedict XIII**.



**31 JUL (Friday):**

## SAINT IGNATIUS of LOYOLA, Priest (1491-1556)

**Ignatius** was born at Loyola in Spain. He served his king as a courtier and a soldier until his thirtieth year. To pass the time of his convalescence after a cannon ball lamed his right leg, he asked for books; the life of Christ and lives of the saints were brought to him. He dedicated himself to Jesus through the intercession of Mary, and founded the **Society of Jesus (Jesuits)**. His *Spiritual Exercises* are, to this day, an essential guide for retreatants.

### FROM FR. MARK G. MAZZA

Msgr. Otellini has asked me to tell you a little about myself.

I was born on March 7, 1954, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, as the third of the five children of Anthony and Sylvia Mazza. I spent a happy childhood in West Mifflin, PA., near to Pittsburgh, close to many relatives on

both sides of the family. In 1967, our family moved to Indiana, where we eventually settled in Munster. Both of my parents are now deceased; may they rest in peace.

After high school I decided to pursue my desire to become a priest, which had entered my heart from the time of my First Holy Communion. Studying for the Diocese of Gary, I was admitted to St. Meinrad College Seminary in the fall of 1972. I graduated in 1976 with a B.A. in Philosophy. From there I was appointed to the North American College in Rome, where I first studied at the Jesuit University the Gregorianum, and then at the Redemptorist Alphonsianum, where I specialized in moral theology. I first met your pastor, Msgr. Otellini, in the fall of 1976 at the North American College. I would never have imagined then that we would be at the same parish almost forty years later. I was ordained a priest in my home parish, St. Thomas More, Munster, Indiana on October 2, 1980 by Bishop Andrew G. Grutka for the Diocese of Gary.

After serving as an associate pastor, and then pastor for over twenty-two years, I came to California for a sabbatical. I attended the Vatican II Institute at St. Patrick Seminary for three months. I fell in love with the Archdiocese of San Francisco and its good people. I requested incardination into the Archdiocese of San Francisco and began with my first assignment at St. Gabriel Parish in San Francisco in January of 2003. January 2016, marks for me thirteen years in this Archdiocese. My official incardination took place after the Chrism Mass right before Easter in 2010, while administrator at St. Peter Parish in Pacifica. I then was named pastor of the same parish.

On July 1, 2012, I was appointed pastor of Star of the Sea Parish San in Francisco. In August 2014, I went on a medical sabbatical. In February 2015, I was appointed parochial vicar at St. Anselm Parish in Ross and on July 1, 2015, I was appointed as the parochial vicar at Nativity to work with Msgr. Otellini. I am looking forward to the time the Lord gives me to be one of your

# Young Believers



### BIBLE MATH:

Let us assume that a grown man will eat, for a light dinner, half of one fish and one loaf of bread (the “loaves” in the Gospel story were probably more like what we would call “rolls” or “buns”).
