21 SEP (Monday): SAINT MATTHEW, Apostle and Evangelist

Matthew was working as a tax collector when he was called by Jesus to follow Him. Matthew's gospel, more than any other, sets out to show that Jesus of Nazareth is the Messiah. Written for his countrymen in Palestine, Matthew wrote his gospel in Aramaic, probably between 42-52 A.D.



23 SEP (Wednesday): SAINT PIO OF PIETRELCINA, Priest (1887-1968)

A Capuchin priest, Padre Pio spent 50 years at the monastery of San Stefano Rotundo, where he was much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor. He was known to pray the Rosary almost continuously throughout the day, and he bore the stigmata.





RELIGIOUS ITEMS FROM THE HOLY LAND

This weekend representatives from Land of Peace will be outside church after Masses selling religious items from the Holy Land. These items are created by Christian families and handicapped of the Holy Land. Land of Peace is a non-profit organization. Their mission is to help and support Christians of the Holy Land and also the Bethlehem Arab Society of Rehabilitation through the Patriarch of Jerusalem. Their main goal is to establish a charity hospital for the poor and sick Christians in the Holy Land. 40% of the profits from these sales go directly back to the families who have created the religious items; 20% goes to the Patriarch of Jerusalem Fuad Twal, who helps the poor Christians with medical care; 20% toward the building of the charity hospital; and the final 20% for expenses. Please help Land of Peace help the Christian families in Bethlehem and protect them from emigrating from the land were Jesus was born.
