SAINTS AND OBSERVANCES

22 JUN (Wednesday):

SAINT PAULINUS OF NOLA, Bishop (354-431)

A distinguished lawyer who held several public offices in the Empire, Paulinus and his wife Therasia retired from public ministry to an estate in Spain. After the loss of their only son at a few weeks' of age, they gave away most of their estates and dedicated themselves to increasing their holiness. Paulinus was chosen bishop of Nola by popular demand, where he governed for more than 21 years. His writings contain one of the earliest examples of a Christian wedding song.

SAINTS JOHN FISHER and THOMAS MORE, Martyrs (1469/1478-1535)

In 1521 Bishop **John Fisher** was asked to study the problem of Henry VIII's marriage. He incurred Henry's anger by defending the validity of the king's marriage with Catherine and later by rejecting Henry's claim to be the supreme head of the Church of England. Like Thomas More, John Fisher refused to take the oath to the new Act of Succession, which would have presumed the legality of the king's divorce and his position as head of the English Church.

Thomas More's belief that no lay ruler has jurisdiction over the Church of Christ cost him his life. Beheaded on Tower Hill, London on **06 July 1535**, More steadfastly refused to approve Henry VIII's divorce and remarriage and establishment of the Church of England. Fisher and More were tried together and executed within two weeks of one another.

THE DIVINE MERCY IMAGE

There have been multiple images of the Divine Mercy produced over the years. Although **Saint Faustina** was frequently consulted about the progress of the original painting, it was her spiritual director and confessor, **Venerable Michael Sopocko**, who was responsible for hiring an artist by the name of **Eugene Kazimirowski** to paint from **Saint Faustina's** description. There is a detailed letter from Fr. Sopocko that describes what happened. He wrote: "For several months the painter was unable to satisfy the author, who became sad on that account, and it was at this time that she wrote in her diary: "Once when I was at that painter's, who's painting this image, and saw that it is not as beautiful as Jesus is, I became very sad, but I hid that deep in my heart. When we left the painter, Mother Superior remained in the city to settle various matters, but I returned home by myself, immediately I made my way to the chapel and I had a good cry. I said to the Lord: 'Who will paint You as beautiful as You are?' Of a sudden I heard the words: 'not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush is the greatness of this image, but in my grace.'" ...



Kazimirowski's painting is the "original", and now hangs in the Cathedral in Vilnius, Lithuania. But many have noted that the facial expression and direction of the rays do not match what Saint Faustina described.



At the end of World War II, an artist named **Adolf Hyla** presented the Sisters of our Lady of Mercy with a painting in thanksgiving that his family had been spared during the war. This painting now hangs above the tomb of Saint Faustina in the convent chapel in Lagiewniki, Poland. Hyla's version is popular in Europe and Latin America.



Based on Saint Faustina's original description of the image, many people were dissatisfied with details of both the Kazimirowski and Hyla versions (the rays in the original were pointing downward, and the right hand in Hyla's is too high, being raised above the shoulder). So an American artist named **Robert Skemp** tried to correct these with his own version. The Skemp version is the most popular version in the Philippines even today, and hangs above the Divine Mercy Shrine in Manila.



All three of the images above have ecclesiastical approval for display in churches and for distribution to the faithful. But a fourth image has become possibly the most wide-spread, painted by another American, **Kathleen Weber**, based on Hyla's version. In fact, some refer to this as the "Hyla by Weber" image.

weak; His humility, perfect obedience to your Will,
and fearless witness to your Truth. May their lives be

entrusted fatherhood. May your Holy Spirit
constantly inspire them with justice and mercy,
wisdom and strength, fidelity and self-giving love.
May they receive Your Grace abundantly in this
earthly life, and may they look forward to eternal
joy in Your presence in the life to come.*
