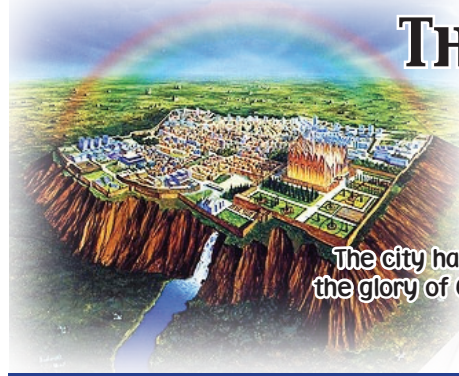

02 MAY (Monday):

SAINT ATHANASIUS, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (297-373)

Known as the “Doctor of the Incarnation” for his writings on this dogma, Athanasius was **Bishop of Alexandria** for 45 years. He attended the **Council of Nicea (325)** and became a prolific polemicist against the Arians, who exiled him five times. He is one of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church.

03 MAY (Tuesday):

SAINTS PHILIP AND JAMES, Apostles

Philip’s request at the Last Supper, “Lord, show us the Father,” prompted Jesus to proclaim unequivocally that he and the Father are one. **James**, the son of Alphaeus, was a cousin of Jesus, and eventually presided over the church in Jerusalem. In his epistle, he encourages us to ask God for wisdom and faith.

NATIVITY FEEDS: A VOICE FOR OTHERS

"Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love" advises Mother Teresa. That is what happened last year at Nativity Parish and School. **Alexander** and **Luke Edward Harding Bradley** (Nativity cantors) started an initiative called **Nativity Feeds**. The money you donated provided lunch for school children in a very poor area of Tanzania (Sanya Station), West Africa. Alexander visited there last year (and Luke Edward hopes to go this year). Alexander delivered Nativity's donation, met the students, saw where the food is cooked, bought and labelled new dishes, and worked with the students and their teachers for a few weeks. Thanks to the generosity of friends and parishioners at Nativity, **450** children have had a lunch of rice and beans every single day, since June 2015 - they have not had this regularity in meals before.

When you step up to help others, you become a voice for and with others, especially those hungry and in pain. We want to use our voices to continue this feeding program. Monsignor Otellini has given Alexander and Luke Edward permission to speak, sing the meditation "The Voice", to remind us that we can be a voice for and with others. There will be a collection at all the Nativity Masses on **Pentecost (14-15 MAY 2016)**. Every single dollar raised during this project goes directly towards the nourishment of the students at this school. We have no expectation that our voices will resolve "great things" such as the extensive problem of hungry children, but we want to follow Mother Teresa's advice of doing "small things with great love". We humbly ask for your support.

HISTORICAL VICTORIES IN PRAYER

How powerful IS the rosary? Consider these events:

October 7, 1571 — In the great battle of Lepanto, October 7th, 1571 a greatly outnumbered force of Christian defenders held off a Turkish invasion. It was considered a miraculous victory brought about specifically through the Rosary (St. Pius V's Crusade had united all of Europe in prayer).

May 13, 1955 — After 700,000 people agreed to pray the Rosary in Austria, the Soviets mysteriously departed the country on the anniversary date of Fatima-May 13th, 1955.

October 13, 1960 — After Pope John XXIII called for prayer, a million pilgrims in Fatima held an all-night prayer vigil before the Blessed Sacrament. The next day, October 13, 1960, an accident destroyed a new Soviet missile, killing many top scientists and setting back the Soviet nuclear arms program by at least 20 years.

May 13, 1984 — After another major Rosary Crusade, a massive explosion on May 13, 1984, eliminated two-thirds of the missiles of the Soviet Union's powerful Northern Fleet.

May 12, 1988 — Four years later it happened again! As thousands prayed all night long, on May 12, 1988, during the vigil of the anniversary of the apparition at Fatima, another major explosion shut down the Soviet Union's only missile plant.
