SAINTS AND OBSERVANCES

SOLEMNITY, FEAST, MEMORIAL • OPTIONAL MEMORIAL • OTHER

17 OCT (Monday)

SAINT IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH, Bishop and Martyr
(c. 50 - c. 107)

Ignatius was a pagan convert to Christianity, who succeeded **Peter** as bishop of Antioch, Syria. He served during the persecution of Domitian, and during the persecution of Trajan, he was ordered taken to Rome to be killed by wild animals. On the way, a journey which took months, he wrote a series of encouraging letters to the churches under his care. He was the first writer to use the term *the catholic Church*. -- *"No earthly pleasures, no kingdoms of this world can benefit me in any way. I prefer death in Christ Jesus to power over the farthest limits of the earth. He who died in place of us is the one object of my quest. He who rose for our sakes is my one desire."*

18 OCT (Tuesday)

SAINT LUKE, Evangelist

Doctor and companion of **St. Paul**, Luke is a patron to both physicians and artists. In addition to his Gospel, Luke authored a history of the early Church in the *Acts of the Apostles*.



19 OCT (Wednesday):

SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES, JOHN DE BRÉBEUF and COMPANIONS, Martyrs

Missionaries to the Mohawks and Iroquois, who were brutally tortured and martyred for the faith in New France.

20 OCT (Thursday)

SAINT PAUL OF THE CROSS, Priest (1694-1775)

After receiving a vision, and while still a layman, Paul founded the *Congregation of Discalced Clerks of the Most Holy Cross and Passion* (the *Passionists*) in 1721 to preach about Jesus Crucified. Paul was a preacher of such power that hardened soldiers and bandits were seen to weep.

22 OCT (Saturday)

SAINT PETER OF ALCANTARA, Priest (1499-1562)

Franciscan who founded the friary at Babajoz at age 20, serving as its superior. He helped with the reforms of the Franciscan order (the *Alcantarine* reforms, today known as the *Strictest Observance*), and was a friend and confessor to **Saint Teresa of Avila**. Peter was a mystic and writer whose works were used by **Saint Francis de Sales**.

With the ever-increasing use of email and texting, the abbreviation “OMG” has come into widespread and common use (even appearing in advertisements for the California lottery at one time!). While many people may regard this as “simply an expression”, it is in fact a **blasphemy**: you are taking the Lord’s name in vain, in violation of the Second Commandment. Are you willing to be a strong Catholic and obey the Commandments that our Creator gave us? Don’t use this “phrase”, and encourage others to follow your good example (it’s a small sacrifice: offer it up for the souls in Purgatory!).

The Church also offers us a **partial indulgence** if we say “Blessed be God” whenever we hear God’s name taken in vain. So the next time someone texts you “OMG”, text them back “BBG”.

And when they ask you what it means, explain this whole situation to them!
