SAINTS AND OBSERVANCES

SOLEMNITY, FEAST, MEMORIAL · OPTIONAL MEMORIAL · OTHER

14 AUG (Monday): SAINT MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, Martyr (1894-1941)

Polish Franciscan priest who was imprisoned by the Nazis at Auschwitz. On **31 July 1941**, in reprisal for one prisoner's escape, ten men were chosen to die by being locked up without food or water. Maximilian offered himself in



place of a young husband and father, where he was the last to die, enduring two weeks of starvation, thirst, and neglect.

15 AUG (Tuesday): FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

"Therefore, just as the glorious resurrection of Christ was an essential part of this victory [over sin and death] and its final trophy, so the struggle shared by the Blessed Virgin and her son was to end in the glorification of her virginal body ... Hence, the august

Mother of God ... the whole-hearted companion of the divine Redeemer ... gained at last the supreme crown of her privileges -- to be preserved immune from the corruption of the tomb ... to be carried up body and soul to the exalted glory of heaven, there to sit in splendor at the right hand of her son, the immortal King of the ages." Pope Pius XII



19 AUG (Saturday): SAINT LOUIS, Bishop (1274-1297)

Born to the nobility, Louis was the son of Charles II of Anjou, king of Naples, and great-nephew of Saint Louis IX, and of Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. He spent seven years as a hostage for his father at Barcelona and Tarragona in Spain. Louis was ordained at age 23, and became the reluctant bishop of Toulouse, France for the last six months of his life.

SAINT JOHN EUDES, Priest (1601-1680)

John worked with plague victims in France, and later formed the *Congregation of Jesus and Mary Eudists* and the *Sisters of Our Lady of Charity*. He authored the liturgical devotion to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.



NATIVITY SCHOOL OF RELIGION: 2017-2018

Registration has begun for Nativity's **Children's Faith Formation Program**. Children who attend public or independent schools in 1st through 8th grades should be enrolled in Nativity's School of Religion for ongoing faith formation.

Registration forms and information packets are available online (www.nativitymenlo.org) under the *School of Religion* link. We encourage all children to continue on in the School of Religion after receiving First Communion, through all grade levels until the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Mrs. Hickam will be available after Masses on 12-13, 20 and 26-27 AUG 2017 and 09-10 SEP 2017 to register your children and answer any questions about the program. Sacrament Class and Classes for grades 1-6 are held on Sundays from 08:15-09:15 AM at Nativity School and continue on into our 09:30 AM Mass with our *Children's Liturgy of the Word* (beginning 24 SEP 2017) Confirmation Preparation Classes are held on Wednesday evenings from 07:00-08:00 PM in the O'Hare Center beginning 11 OCT 2017.

First Reconciliation/First Holy Communion requires 2 years of instruction before a child is eligible to receive these Sacraments. Children should be enrolled in 1st grade.

Confirmation Preparation is also a 2-year program as required by the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Children should be enrolled as they enter 7th grade, but will include older students who have not yet been confirmed.

A kick-off celebration will be held on 17 SEP 2017 (Catechetical Sunday), after the 09:30AM Mass. Classes begin on Sunday, 24 SEP 2017 and the Confirmation Classes begin on 11 OCT 2017.

Young Believers

START (OR EXPAND) A FAMILY PRAYER TRADITION. FIND OPPORTUNITIES TO PRAY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY, AND MAKE A COMMITMENT TO SAY THOSE PRAYERS TOGETHER AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE.

1. Do you say a blessing before each meal? Do you do so even when you are dining at someone else's house, or at a restaurant? It is a simple and wonderful way to share your faith.

Bless Us, O Lord, and these Thy gifts, which we are about to receive; From Thy bounty, through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.



2. THE LEONINE PRAYERS

In 1884, Pope Leo XIII prescribed the recitation of a set of prayers immediately after Mass. In 1934, Pope Pius XI ordered that these same prayers be offered after Mass for the conversion of Russia. These prayers are now optional, but what a wonderful family tradition you could start if you stayed a few minutes after Mass and said this simple set of prayers. Here are the Leonine Prayers:

A. "HAIL, MARY" (three times)

Hail, Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee;
Blessed are thou amongst women, and
blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.
Holy Mary, Mother of God,
pray for us sinners, now and at
the hour of our death. Amen.

B. "HAIL, HOLY QUEEN"

Hail, Holy Queen, mother of mercy;
our life, our sweetness, and our hope.
To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve.
To thee do we send up our sighs,
mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.
Turn then, most gracious advocate,
thine eyes of mercy towards us. And after this,
our exile, show unto us the blessed
fruit of thy womb, Jesus.
Oh clement, oh loving, oh sweet Virgin Mary.
Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God,
that we may be made worthy of
the promises of Christ. Amen.

C. A collect

Let us pray. O God, our refuge and our strength, look down in mercy on Thy people who cry to Thee, and by the intercession of the glorious and immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of God, of St. Joseph her Spouse, of Thy blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the saints, in mercy and goodness hear our prayers for the conversion of sinners, and for the liberty and exultation of our holy Mother the Church.

Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

D. PRAYER to SAINT MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

Saint Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle;
be our protection against the wickedness
and snares of the devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray:
and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host,
by the power of God, cast into hell Satan
and all the wicked spirits
who wander through the world
seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

E. Conclusion (three times)

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, Have mercy upon us.

3. What other ideas can you come up with? How about an evening prayer before bed that the family says together? Or a morning prayer before everyone starts their day? Or maybe a family rosary, even once a week?

POPE LEO XIII himself wrote the "St. Michael prayer" (a much longer version, which was changed to the one above in 1934). On 13 October 1884 the pope fell

into a mystical faint after Mass, during which he was given a vision of the battle between the heavenly and demonic hosts. It was so horrifying that he immediately went to his office and composed this prayer of protection.
