14 FEB (Tuesday):

SAINT CYRIL and SAINT METHIDIUS, Bishops
(~826 - ~884)

Greek brothers, both monks, who preached successfully among the Russians and Moravians and became known as the “*Apostles to the Slavs*.” They mastered the Slavic language and codified an alphabet for it (the forerunner of the “Cyrillic” alphabet used in the Russian language today). They frequently incurred ecclesial censure for using Slavonic—the vernacular of their congregation—in the liturgy.

17 FEB (Friday):

THE SEVEN FOUNDERS OF THE ORDER OF SERVITES (1233)

On the **Feast of the Assumption in 1240**, the Founders received a vision of Our Lady. She held in her hand a black habit, and a nearby angel bore a scroll reading *Servants of Mary*. Mary told them, “You will found a new order, and you will be my witnesses throughout the world. This is your name: Servants of Mary. This is your rule: that of **Saint Augustine**. And here is your distinctive sign: the black scapular, in memory of my sufferings.” By **1285** there were 10,000 members with houses in Germany, France, Italy, and Spain.

The Story of Saint Valentine

Valentine was a Roman bishop at a time when the emperor Claudius was persecuting the church. Claudius also issued an edict that prohibited the marriage of young people. This was based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to them or their wives or families if they died.

“It was a very permissive society in which Valentine lived,” says Father Frank O’Gara, a priest at Whitefriar Street Church in Dublin, Ireland. “Polygamy would have been much more popular than just one woman and one man living together. And yet some of them seemed to be attracted to Christian faith. But obviously the church taught that marriage was very sacred between one man and one woman, for their life, and that it was to be encouraged. And so this edict immediately presented a problem to the Christian church of what to do about this. The idea of encouraging them to marry within the Christian church was what Valentine was about. And he secretly married couples because of the edict.”

Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for performing marriage ceremonies against the command of Emperor Claudius II. There are legends surrounding Valentine’s actions while in prison.

One of the men who was to judge him in line with the Roman law was a man called Asterius, whose daughter was blind. Valentine was supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became a Christian as a result.

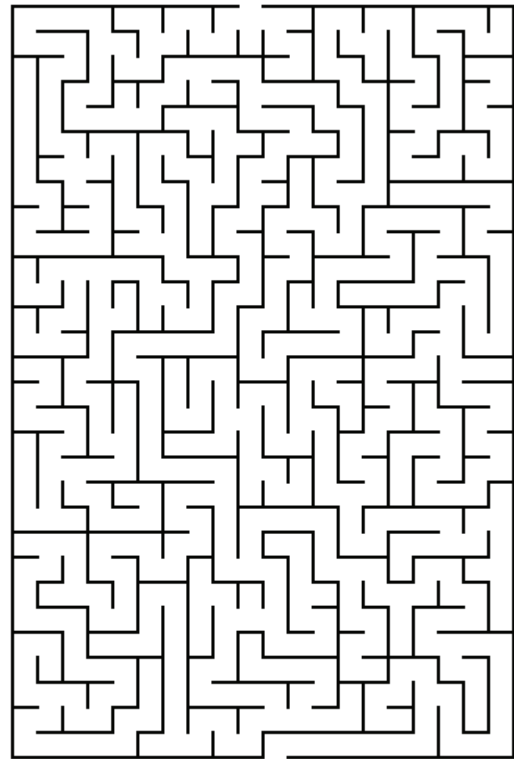
In the year 269 AD, Valentine was sentenced to a three part execution of a beating, stoning, and finally decapitation, all because of his stand for Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius’ daughter, signing it “from your Valentine.”

“What Valentine means to me as a priest,” explains Father O’Gara, “is that there comes a time where you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. And with the power of the Holy Spirit we can do that -- even to the point of death.”

Whitefriar Street Church in Dublin is home to relics of Saint Valentine, granted by Pope Gregory XVI.
